Context

- Flanders – Regional Agency in Health and Care
 - Exclusive competences and shared competences
 - Policy maker and policy implementation
- EUREGHA:
 - European Network of Regional and Local Health Authorities
 - Chair of the network in 2010
 - Added value of regional cooperation
 - Planning and dialogue are crucial

Challenges

- Policy development requires evidence based initiatives
- Can we compare tools – benchmark initiatives?
 - At what stage: policy development, implementation
- Tools for policy development?
- Tools for policy implementation?

Challenges

- Communication with other policy areas
- Communication with groups addressing specific needs
- European, national policy development is wide, mere a frame and trendsetter
- Increasing role for regional and local policy development – target oriented
- Demanding effort to raise awareness of the public
- Costs and Benefits of policy changes
- **Health inequalities: reduce or minimize structural inequalities**

Lessons learned

- Policy areas to be carefully looked upon
- Sustainability in policy initiatives requires focus and planning
- Project tools are useful for key shifts in thinking in health policy development
- Successful cross policy working requires
 - The launch of a sequential process
 - Partnership and ownership

Fill in missing links

- Health in all policies = fact
 - What in reality?
 - What is missing: continuous process of dialogue
 - Mandatory and enforced
 - Voluntary basis
 - Strengthen awareness raising is key:
 - Evidence based intersectoral dialogue
 - *Strategic way*
- EU health dialogue: filters down to multi-level and multi-stakeholders dialogue
 - Health Strategy
 - Joint Actions
 - Dialogue groups
- Are the results satisfactory or do we need to move to another stage?
 - Mutual decline of the responsibility and financial support
 - Different priorities

Recommendations for future opportunities in Europe

- More than dialogue: strategic planning
 - ‘HealthyRegions’ Toolbox
 - Comply with other tools - methods
 - Basis for all cooperation
- Reinforce strategic planning in policy development over a multitude of stakeholders, sectors and in multi-level governance
- Use the toolbox to develop in each sector political willingness, responsibility and funding
- Use the tools for sustainable policy development
- Future Health Strategy and focus of a future Public Health Programme to disseminate results and create a ‘Health Policy Literacy’
